Dr. Mireille Kamda, our financial keepsake, thank you for your resilience and accountability. Dr. Marie Mbellasube, thank you for all the support as Secretary At Large.
- Our leadership and professional development team, led by Dr. Senge Balimba, has organized our bimonthly Pharmacy Talks this year, and the convention education subcommittee led by Dr. Loveta Epie in 2022, 2023 and 2025, and by Dr. Carole Abam in 2024, has worked tirelessly to provide excellent speakers, CE presentations and workshops during our conventions. Your commitment to this organization is beyond measure. Thank You!
- Our compliance committee, under Dr. Siagat's leadership, has ensured our 501(c) status and secured a mailbox and central repository for all CAMPhA correspondence and materials.

ALLERGIC REACTIONS: BASIC INTERVENTIONS

A

llergies are immune system responses to typically harmless

substances, affecting millions in the U.S. Nearly 18 million

adults in the United States have hay fever, or allergic rhinitis.

At least 1 in 3 American adults and 1 in 4 children have allergies. They are the sixth-leading cause of chronic illness. Potential causes include common allergens such as animal dander, insect stings, foods (milk, eggs, peanuts, tree nuts, fish, shellfish), medicines, and pollens. The reactions can be mild, moderate, or severe occurring within seconds, minutes, or in rare cases, up to 24 hours after exposure. Symptoms can involve multiple body systems such as respiratory, cutaneous, cardiovascular, gastrointestinal. The management involves multiple non-pharmacologic (avoiding the trigger) and pharmacologic strategies (various medication classes) that will be discussed during this presentation.


